Groundhog Day traces it's origins back to the 15th century and the Christian celebration of Candlemas. On February 2nd, Christians would take their candles to the church to be blessed thinking this would bring blessings to their household for the remaining winter. When Germans learned of this tradition they introduced the thought that if a

hedgehog saw his shadow on Candlemas Day there would be 6 more weeks of bad weather. Germans who later settled in the U.S. were unable to locate the humble hedgehog so they settled for the groundhog as their mascot. Groundhog Day first appeared in the newspaper in 1886 in Punxsutawney, PA. Many religions still celebrate Candlemas featuring an elegant procession of candles, not a giant squirrel.
