Did you know that St. Patrick wasn't Irish? He was born in England and captured at age 16 by Irish slave traders. He spent 6 years in captivity tending sheep before returning to his homeland where he studied religion for many years before returning to Ireland as an ordained priest. There are many legends

associated with his persona including the belief that he created the Celtic cross by embedding the pagan circle of light onto the cross to help him convert pagans to Christianity. Later writings mention his use of the Shamrock to explain the Holy Trinity. St. Patrick died on March 17, 460 A.D. but was never formally canonized as a saint.

In which book of the Bible is the word "EASTER" first mentioned?



Yes, it's a trick question. Trying to determine the origin of the word "Easter" involves Latin terms, German derivatives, and theoretical speculation, and yet pedants readily agree: nobody really knows. Instead we'll explore the provenance of the Easter bunny and why he delivers eggs.

In the 13<sup>th</sup> century, the church decided there were not nearly enough rules so they forbade Christians to eat eggs the week before Easter. Chickens, however, were apparently uninformed of this regulation and continued their daily practice of

laying eggs. Not wanting the eggs to go to waste, people began to decorate and give them as gifts, eventually presenting them in ornate woven baskets made to look like nests. We can thank the imaginative Germans in the 1700's for the idea that the Easter bunny lays, decorates, and hides eggs for good children to find on Resurrection Sunday. In Switzerland, the ubiquitous cuckoo bird, not a rabbit, brings Easter eggs. Australians the employ a Bilby, a less-attractive, snout-nosed cousin of the rabbit.
